In May, he performed to an audience of more than 200 at his school and received a standing ovation.

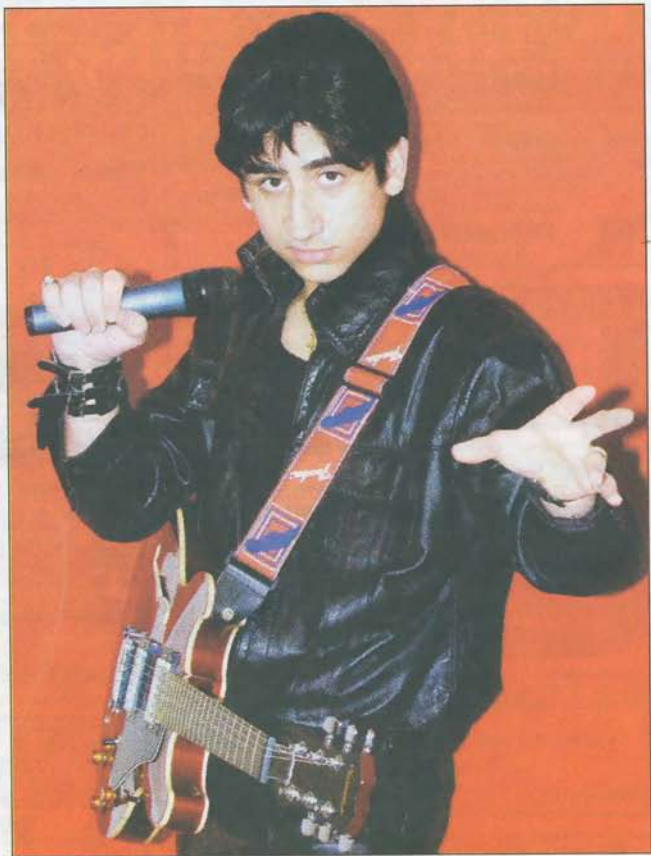
After Sean finishes year 12 he wants to visit Graceland and go to Las Vegas to perform his shows.
